- The financial aid offer is based on all available information. Your offer may result in a reduced award for example, to be eligible to receive a Federal Direct Student Loan you must be enrolled and attending on an hour or half-time basis for credit hours during the Fall and Spring terms, and four credit hours during the Summer.
- Awards are subject to change based upon the availability of federal or state funds.
- You may only receive financial aid for the amount required for your program at DMACC.

- Alpha split of students between counselors

- Work Study assistance

- WAIVER
- Waiving verification of 21-22 FAFSA/ISIR information, except for:
 - Identify/statement of educational purpose and HS completion status in verification tracking groups V4 and V5.
 - Conflicting information rules did not change. Must be resolved.
 - Still had to review any documents we received.

Measuring impact of the V1 override

We implemented changes on August 9, 2021.

IOWA

- Analyzed 2 groups of students:
 - 1) August 9 students receiving V1 Override (589 students)
 - 2) August 9 and students receiving V1 Override through August 29 (654 students)
- Group 1) **August 9, 2021** = date we “flipped the switch” (put override on) 589 students.
 - On August 9, 2021 = total dollars awarded to this group of students nearly \$7.7 M (\$7,691,811).
 - On August 29, 2021, of this Aug. 9 group receiving the override, Fall aid awarded = \$4,054,912
 - On August 29, 2021, of this Aug. 9 group receiving the override, Fall aid released = \$2,667,686 (66%)
- 723 students impacted as of 10/21/22

V1 Waiver Impact

IOWA

- **Students and their Families**
 - Reduced barriers for students
