Spotlight: MASFAA Leadership Symposium

I had the privilege of attending the MASFAA Leadership Symposium June 7-11 at the beautiful Osthoff Resort in Elkhart Lake, WI. The purpose and mission of MASFAA is “to promote and provide quality training and professional development opportunities, to advocate and support financial aid programs, and to facilitate effective communication and coordination among interrelated professional associations, thereby serving the needs and interests of students and post-secondary institutions”.


